Mobile Work Crew Focusing on Manufacturing Careers

Since 2018, Licking County Job & Family Services and Ohio Means Jobs | Licking County's **C**omprehensive **C**ase **M**anagement & **E**mployment **P**rogram (CCMEP) has operated a work experience concept known as the **M**obile **W**ork **C**rew (MWC). The concept primarily focusing on manufacturing, is designed for youth, ages 18-24 to obtain work experience, occupational skills training, and education for workforce preparation. The CCMEP MWC youth tour and job shadow at various local employers to develop an understanding of what careers are available in the community, while working on credentialing and/or other training that increases their likelihood for employment.

This year, the MWC youth were able to experience career exploration in specialized labs at C-TEC of Licking County prior to visiting local manufacturers. They completed first aid, CPR and safety training while at C-TEC.

There were a total of 11 youth that participated during two sessions. They visited a wide variety of employers, as shown in the list at right.

Two individuals were hired and are currently employed because of the MWC experience. One individual has completed the interview process and hopes to start working soon. Three individuals are doing additional work experience to explore other career options. Three others are completing additional training in HVAC, Cyber Security and Professional Firefighter.

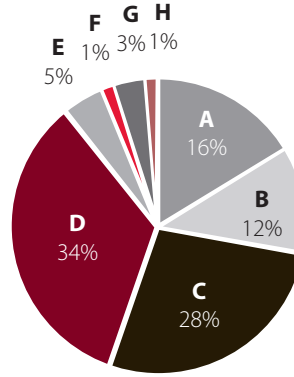

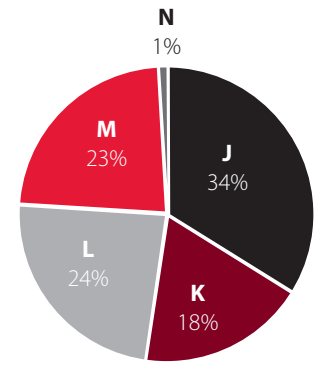
